Becoming involved in the community provides access to communal knowledge and skills. These can support you and your family as a means of integration and connection to the village and its lifestyle.

The community based native revegetation project is working towards a self-sustaining natural environment by collecting seeds and growing indigenous plants, from grasses and sedges to major trees.

The aim is to provide a clean green natural environment for future generations.



Membership is open to any who live within 'reasonable walking distance' (to reduce food miles and who support the goals of the garden. Regular working bees are held. School and other group visits by arrangement.
